



# What's New in 2009/2010

## New Journal Collections

- **SAGE Deep Backfiles** – More than 380 digitized SAGE journals from their first issue through 1998.
- **IEEE/IET Electronic Library** – Expanded coverage now includes full-text IEEE /IET conference proceedings, transactions and journals (back to 1988 where available), as well as IEEE Standards.
- **Lippincott, Williams and Wilkins Complete Nursing Collection** – 60 nursing and allied health journals. Coverage varies by title, with most including at least 2003-present.
- **JSTOR Arts & Sciences Collection VII** – The most recent collection of more than 180 eJournals in the arts, sciences and social sciences, which will be completed in 2010.
- **JSTOR 19<sup>th</sup> Century British Pamphlets** – Online access to the most significant British pamphlets from the 19th century held in UK research libraries. Focus is on the political, economic and social issues of the time.

## New Reference, eBook and Other Resources

- **Bibliography of Asian Studies** – An index to western-language articles and book chapters on all parts of Asia.
- **Biotechnology and Bioengineering Abstracts** – Citations to research, applications, regulatory developments and new patents across all areas of biotechnology and bioengineering, including medical, pharmaceutical, agricultural, environmental and marine biology.
- **Blackwell Encyclopedia of Sociology** – Includes more than 1,800 searchable entries on topics in sociology and related disciplines. Updated three times per year.
- **Dictionary of Literary Biography** – More than 16,000 biographical and critical essays on the lives, works, and careers of the world's most influential literary figures from all eras and genres.
- **Early American Imprints, Series I (Evans)** – This full-text historical collection contains books, pamphlets, broadsides, newspapers, government documents and ephemera printed in America over three centuries.
- **iPoll** – A comprehensive database of 500,000 questions and answers asked in the US since 1935. Also included is the Roper Center public opinion data, which is the largest archive of public opinion information.
- **Social Work Abstracts** – Indexes more than 450 social work and human services journals.
